2019 Achievements, Appreciations and Merry Christmas!

As our last Dunstan E-News for the year, I would like extend my thanks to you, our supporters, for another year of partnership in social justice outcomes for our community.

The support we receive is invaluable to the continuation of our work to inspire action for a fairer world. Every little bit of support counts-whether that be attending events, financial or in-kind donations, volunteering or being a corporate partner. Our team has made some excellent progress in our programs and events this year, and I would like to share with you the highlights.



Our work as the backbone organisation of the Adelaide Zero Project has allowed us to collaborate with more than 40 organisations from across the public, private, community and university sectors, collectively taking on the challenge to achieve Functional Zero street homelessness in the Adelaide CBD by the end of next year.

Connections Week brought together hundreds of volunteers to help us connect with those sleeping rough. This allowed us to collect data within a snapshot of time, which we have since updated monthly and reported on our online **dashboard**. We have now housed more than 260 people since the Project commenced in May 2018. This is a wonderful achievement - one which belongs to the **AZP collective** whose dedication to working together to end homelessness is remarkable.

Our participation in the Adelaide Zero Project has also helped inform our annual **Homelessness Conference**, which was a sell-out success in August. Thank you to all who attended and those who generously **sponsored** the event.

This year the **Thinkers in Residence program** focused on wrapping up the Social Capital Residencies (SCR), with visits from Allyson Hewitt and Dr Ilse Treurnicht of the MaRS Discovery District in Toronto. As the final visit of the SCR, they offered insights into how to grow the purpose economy in South Australia, in particular the integration of social innovation into economic policy.

In November, we also welcomed **Dr Nonie Brennan**, Senior Advisor to the Institute of Global Homelessness and former Chief Executive Officer of All Chicago: Making Homelessness History, who shared her expertise in homelessness prevention, innovative forms of fundraising and collective impact.

The final report for the SCR will be released in the new year along with the Dr Nonie Brennan residency report and recommendations. We would like to express our thanks for the support from **our partners** of the Thinkers in Residence program, as well as the

growing movement of business leaders and professionals supporting the development of a more purposeful economy.

Our Foundation's focus on **Aboriginal Economic Empowerment** saw David Rathman AM deliver this year's **Lowitja O'Donoghue Oration** with an emphasis on the role that storytelling plays in the wellbeing of Aboriginal people. It was an inspiring and worthwhile event and we pay thanks to our **event sponsors** for their support.

On **Mental Health**, we held our third annual **AdMental** event in April, which had the theme of *Loneliness in our Older Population*. Each year, two creative teams battle it out '*Gruen*' style as they pitch their videos which attempt to 'sell' positive wellbeing.'

Migration is the last of our focus areas, and this year we have been supporting the Migration and Refugee Research Network (MARRNet) which has a broad membership. We see many wonderful things ahead in 2020 for MARRNeT, and note our gratitude for the support of AMES Australia as a presenting partner of this work.

As part of this year's **Art For Good** program, we funded and presented the **DDFSALA Festival Award** for artists exploring social justice themes, and the **Emerging Artist Prize** at the 2019 **Our Mob Exhibition** in August, which celebrated the vitality of Aboriginal art making across South Australia.

If you thought 2019 sounded busy, wait until you see what we have in store for 2020! We look forward to welcoming you to one of our fantastic events, enrolling you as one of our partners, or other forms of support which enable us to continue inspiring action for a fairer world.

In the meantime, we wish you a safe and happy Christmas, and all the best for the new year!

The night demonstrated the level of financial and social support that these innovative services can inspire, and highlighted how anyone can be a philanthropist!



Thinkers in Residence



Dr Nonie Brennan's Visit

Our most recent Thinker in Residence was homeless prevention expert Dr Nonie Brennan, who visited us from the 4 - 22 November. Throughout Dr Brennan's residency, she attended 11 site visits, 31 meetings, 4 events and engaged with an incredible 530 people.

These site visits and meetings with services, government organisation and non-for-profits enabled Dr Brennan to deliver invaluable recommendations and advice to improve the homelessness system in Adelaide, and in particular, how to achieve the goals of the Adelaide Zero Project. Dr Brennan also met with the Minister for Human Services and the Lord Mayor of Adelaide to discuss their individual roles within South Australia's homelessness system.

This was a very successful visit that we could not have done without the support of our residency partners; the University of Adelaide, Flinders University, Department of the Premier and Cabinet, SA Health, Origin Energy, Uniting Communities, Red Cross SA, and the City of Adelaide.

What's Next?

A report is currently being produced with a series of recommendations from Dr Brennan on how we can address and end street homelessness in the Adelaide CBD. This report is due to be released in the new year - stay tuned!




